

## **Maidenhair Fern**

Adiantum pedatum

**Full Shade** 

Rich, peaty, moist, acidic soil

12-20" tall; clump-forming

Delicate flat sprays of green leaflets on thin dark stems Very attractive in summer breezes

May be deer resistant



**Marginal Wood Fern** 

Dryopteris marginalis

**Evergreen Perennial** 

Part Shade, Full Shade

Height: 18-24" Spread: 24-30"

Clump-forming

Average, moist, well-drained, humusy acidic soil May be drought resistant once established

Golden-brown fiddleheads appear in spring Deeply cut dark green arching fronds form a vase shape Noticeable brown sori on the margins of the undersides

Attracts songbirds
Rabbit resistant
May be deer resistant



### **Ostrich Fern**

Matteuccia struthiopteris

**Deciduous Fern** 

Shade to Part Sun/Part Shade

Height: 2-3' Spread: 3-4' (Much larger in its natural habitat)
Clump-forming

Fertile, moist to wet soils
Tolerates clay

Dark green fronds emerge from central crown Feathery fronds are very showy

Best source for delicious fiddleheads!

May be rabbit and deer resistant



**Christmas Fern** 

Polystichum acrostichoides

Evergreen Fern

Part Shade to Deep Shade

Height: 1 - 2'

Moist, slightly acidic soil
Will tolerate sandy and higher pH soils
Drought resistant and hardy
Perfect for shady areas
Good for borders or as ground cover
Useful for greenery on north-facing sides of structures

May be deer resistant



# **Appalachian Sedge**

Carex appalachica

Perennial Semi-Evergreen Ornamental Sedge

Partial Shade to Full Shade

Height and Spread: 10 - 12" Weeping, mop-like shape, clumping habit

Suited for all but poorly drained soil

Thrives in dry, shaded sites

Good for soil stabilization and erosion control

Dark green foliage, very fine texture Blooms late spring with few flowers, not showy

> Attracts birds and insects May be deer resistant



Pennsylvania Sedge

Carex pensylvanica

Perennial Ornamental Sedge

Part Sun to Full Shade

Height and Spread: 6-12" Forms a rounded tuft, may be used as groundcover

Light-textured, well-drained soil Tolerates dry soil

Fine-textured glossy green foliage, year-round accent Insignificant flowers in late spring, followed by airy seed stalks Sandy tan foliage in fall

Attracts butterflies, birds, other pollinators

May be deer resistant



## **Northern Sea Oats/Indian Wood Oats**

Chasmanthium latifolium

**Ornamental Grass** 

Part Sun, Shade

Height: 2'-4' Spread: 1'-2' Clump forming

Average, moist, well-drained, soil

Flat, nodding green seed heads, resembling oats, appear in spring, turning bronze in the fall
Attractive when swaying in breezes
Will self-seed in optimal conditions

Larval host for butterflies
Food source for small mammals and birds
May be deer and rabbit resistant



#### **Gold Dew Tufted Hair Grass**

Deschampsia cespitosa 'Goldtau'

Semi-Evergreen Ornamental Grass Clump form

Height: 1'-2' Spread: 2'

Sun, Part Shade

Moist to wet, well-drained humusy soil

Long-lasting airy sprays of chartreuse-yellow flowerheads bloom in early summer, becoming bronze-gold from autumn through to frost

Fine textured dark green foliage

Attracts songbirds and other pollinators
May be deer resistant



## **Shenandoah Switch Grass**

Panicum virgatum 'Shenandoah'

Perennial Ornamental Grass

Full Sun to Part Shade

Height and Spread: 3-4' Narrow and upright form

Adaptable Soil: Clay, sandy, average Medium to wet, well-drained

Blue-green early spring foliage turns burgundy-red in summer Clouds of small red flowers in August, followed by airy seed heads with tan foliage in winter

Attracts birds
May be deer resistant



#### The Blues Little Bluestem

Schizachyrium scoparium 'The Blues'

Perennial Ornamental Grass

Full Sun

Height: 2-4' Spread: 1.5-2' Clumping form

Well-drained sandy or loamy soil Tolerates clay, drought tolerant once established

Fine textured blue-tinted foliage on slender upright pinkish stems
White, shiny tufts of seeds in fall and winter
Excellent burgundy-red color in fall

Seeds feed small birds in winter May be deer resistant
